CODE OF CONDUCT

The following Code of Conduct applies principally but not exclusively to the conduct expected of members when participating in the club's Social Tennis matches.

PLEASE DO:

- 1. Use the pegboard system.
- 2. Wear recognised tennis clothing or tracksuit bottoms / tops.
- 3. Wear clothes or equipment designed to hold a spare tennis ball e.g. pockets, ball clip.
- 4. Fill water bottles before going on court, and at the end of a set.
- 5. Set all mobile phones to silent or vibrate.
- 6. Promote free-flowing play by adopting a positive attitude and manner.
- 7. Play to the server's pace.
- 8. Consider your opponent's ability when executing a shot.
- 9. Compliment your partner or opponent after a good shot.
- 10. Accept unplanned interruptions to play with good grace e.g. comfort breaks.
- 11. Shake hands at the end of a match.

PLEASE DO NOT:

- 1. Try to remove juniors from the courts before 2pm on Saturdays, they have priority.
- 2. Indulge in idle or irrelevant chit-chat on court.
- 3. Use racist, sexist, profane, abusive, or derogatory language. This includes snide comments.
- 4. Whack tennis balls back to the server's end at the end of a point or game.
- 5. Whack service returns back when the serve was clearly long / wide.
- 6. Throw your tennis racket or hit tennis court infrastructure with it.
- 7. Be too hard on yourself.
- 8. Use cameras with the flash turned on.
- 9. Wear scruffy or gardening clothes.
- 10. Wear worn tennis shoes.
- 11. Spit on or off court.
